# 2023-2024 Scholastic Merit Award Application

#### - THE PROGRAM -

The Scholastic Merit Award Program is sponsored by The New England Mechanical Contracting Industry Improvement Fund. Its purpose is to make funds for higher education available to the children of both labor and management employees of the Mechanical Contracting Industry. The Fund will award a number of annual scholastic merit awards in the amount of \$2,000. The top winner will be awarded the Casey Memorial Award of \$2,500. Winners must attend an accredited post-secondary institution in the United States, as full-time students, and may select any course of study.

## - ELIGIBILITY -

## To be eligible, the applicant must be a

- 1) secondary school senior who will graduate during the current academic year,
- 2) high school graduate who has not been out of high school more than three years, (excluding military service), or
- 3) freshman, sophomore, or junior, full-time student, in good standing, at an accredited college

#### and be either

1) a son or daughter whose parent is a management employee (not a member of a union) of a mechanical contracting company who is supporting, by way of contributions, the New England Mechanical Contracting Industry Improvement Fund

#### or

2) a son or daughter whose parent is an <u>active</u> journeyman member of a participating Local Union, and on whose behalf, contributions are currently being made by an employer to the New England Mechanical Contracting Industry Improvement Fund.

#### - HOW TO PROCEED -

To apply for a **New England Mechanical Contracting Industry Improvement Fund Scholastic Merit Award,** you must do the following:

#### **HIGH SCHOOL APPLICANTS**

If you are a High School Student-Complete application. Submit requested information on separate sheet. Submit SAT or ACT scores and high school transcript.

#### **COLLEGE APPLICANTS**

If you are a college student-Complete application. Submit requested information on separate sheet. Submit a copy of your most recent semester grades.

#### - HOW WINNERS ARE DETERMINED -

The New England Mechanical Contracting Industry Improvement Fund Scholastic Merit Awards winners will be selected by an independent scholarship committee of educators from fields of education whose training and experience qualify them to evaluate applicants by use of such information as the candidate's academic record, extracurricular activities, school recommendation, student's own statements and test scores. Winners will be announced in July. Each Scholastic Merit Award will become effective when the winner is enrolled as a full-time student, in the college or school to which he or she has been admitted. The Scholastic Merit Award will be sent directly to each winner. The award will be forwarded directly to you within a month upon results.
