The General Election for all officers & other elected positions of the Enterprise Association will be held on Saturday, June 3, 2023, from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM at the Steamfitters Local 638 Union Meeting Hall, 32-32 48th Ave, Long Island City, NY 11101.

The election results will be reported on the same day, Saturday, June 3rd at the meeting hall of Plumbers Local 1 located at 50-02 5th Street, Long Island City, NY 11101. Doors will open at 6:00PM with the unofficial election results to be announced after they are tallied. As always, the official election results will not be finalized until they are certified by the election company, Elections USA, Inc., which is anticipated to occur three (3) business days after the election.

I encourage every member of Local 638 who would like to run for office and contribute to the prosperity and success of your Local Union to do so. In addition, I encourage every member to vote, the future of your livelihood depends on you electing solid leadership moving forward.

Business Manager's Report



Brothers and Sisters,

As the trusteeship comes to an end and we return to self-governance, I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on the past few years and focus on what we need to do to keep Local 638 going strong.

I am incredibly proud of all that we – the membership, the officers, and the staff of Local 638 – have accomplished together over the past two and a half years, despite the terrible circumstances thrust upon us. We have come through a very difficult period marked by the indictments and a global pandemic with our union intact and on the right course. But there are lessons to be learned. We must be diligent and thoughtful about how we move forward. We need leadership that protects Local 638 and our way of life. Our livelihoods – and the security of our families – depend on it.

I want to thank each and every one of you who gave your unwavering support to Local 638 during the most difficult period in our union's history. By continuing to do what you do best – practicing our craft with dignity, pride and honor every single day and demonstrating the superiority of union labor – it is you, the membership, that is responsible for restoration of our cherished reputation.

We did more than simply survive over the last two and a half years. We have many accomplishments to be proud of:

- ❖ Despite some economic headwinds, we provided significantly enhanced benefits to the membership. This was no accident. One of the most important duties of the Business Manager is to protect our Trust Funds, amounting to well over \$2 billion dollars in investments. Your union trustees and I have been prudent in the management of your Trust Funds, and as a result, we provided the largest increase ever in our Pension Fund. The pension benefit rose from \$112 per credited year to \$130 for past service and \$145 for all years going forward. Also, we issued a 13th check to all our retirees. All this was done while maintaining solid “green level” funding. Additionally, we have provided a new child care benefit through the Security Benefit Fund. Members can now be reimbursed for certified child care services. In a world of two income households this benefit will help ease an ever increasing financial burden on our brothers and sisters.

- ❖ The lasting impacts of the pandemic have slowed our recovery in some markets, such as office fit out. Local 638 adapted and rose to the challenge, as we have always done. Over the past two years we attacked growing markets, such as storage and warehouse construction. This is a market where we had almost no presence. In 2021, we had less than 1% of each of these markets. Today we have 35% and 58% respectively. Again, this was no accident. We seized the opportunity to attack our non-union competitors in a market where many of them get their start, and we are killing our competition in the crib.
- ❖ We have strengthened our training center with a robust curriculum to meet the challenges ahead as new technologies and markets evolve.
- ❖ We are reshaping the way we engage politically to advance the interest of OUR membership. Local 638 has a new political team and under the leadership of our President we have implemented a cohesive new political strategy, and created a new team of rank and file members to act as political coordinators in their local communities. We remain focused on advancing policies that support the prosperity of Local 638 and thank all that have contributed, and continue to contribute, to that effort.

It has been the greatest honor of my career to serve this union as your Business Manager during this challenging period. When asked to lead the local out of one of its darkest times, I accepted the challenge and worked diligently day in and day out to manage the complex business matters of Local 638 with the best interest of the membership driving every decision. We are finally on the right course, despite the circumstances inflicted upon us, because we have steadily navigated the chaos. We can now see better times ahead.

I look forward to continuing to serve this local and am encouraged by what the future holds for all of us. God Bless you all and God Bless 638

Dear Brothers & Sisters;

As a reminder, if you have not done so already, please come in and pick up the 2023 – 2025 UA card along with your stamp card and an updated 638 ID card. If you are retired and have yet to receive your new card, please call the Dues Office at 718-392-4074 and ask them to mail it out to you. All working members should come into the office for their new cards. Your updated Local 638 ID card will be needed to vote in the upcoming election being held on Saturday, June 3, 2023.

As a reminder NO CASH will be accepted in the Union Office.

You can continue to pay your dues either by coming in or mailing a check or money order. You can also set up with your bank to mail us a check monthly, if so please remember to use your book number as your account number. And as always you can pay your dues online using a debit or credit card at www.steamfitters638.org. To log onto to Local 638's website you use your last name as your "Username" and your book # as your "Password".

Just so you know even if you do not pay your dues online you can still log on to our website anytime to see when you are paid through. The site is updated daily to give you your current dues status.

Please Remember

To vote in any Union Election a member must be in good standing for one (1) year prior to the day of the election.

To be a Nominee in any Union Election a member must be in good standing for two (2) years prior to the day of nomination.

"Good Standing" means no reinstatement fee has been either paid or owed.

The Union Dues Office will not be open on Election Day, Saturday June 3, 2023. Please come into the dues office to pick up all new cards prior to the election.

President's Viewpoint



Brothers and Sisters,

I hope and trust that you and your families are well and getting ready for the warm spring weather. The first quarter has been a busy time for our union, politically speaking, and I wanted to keep you aware of some of the important issues and our activities to push our agenda with elected officials. After a successful campaign cycle, in November, we have continued the work of meeting with politicians to lay out the agenda we need them to support in the coming year and educate them about our industry. This involves sit downs in their offices, breakfasts and sometimes tours of our training center and introductions to members in their districts. It is essential that we put a face to our union, and make sure that 638 is at the forefront of their minds when they have decisions to make that will affect the unionized construction workforce. I want to thank the Business Agents and members, from apprentices to retirees, who have helped with those efforts.

Spring and summer are a critical time for politics in the state of New York, at the state and local level, and every member is affected. Our governor and state legislature are currently considering the future of gaming, casinos and racing in New York State, and how to publicly subsidize those industries. We have been active at community forums and townhalls in Queens and Long Island to say that public loans and subsidies for casinos and racetracks must support union jobs performed under PLAs. Additionally, we have been active in Albany demanding that the state legislature fully fund the development of thermal energy networks and make the fifteen largest state-owned facilities 'shovel ready' for a transition to clean energy by 2025, guaranteeing the use of all union labor. In the City, we continue to educate the Council and Department of Buildings on the need for fire safety sprinklers in as many buildings and facilities as possible and ensure that Local 638 is at the center of efforts to prevent the devastating fires we continue to read about in the news. There are many more issues and legislative proposals to address in the coming months that we will be diligent in monitoring and advocating around, including the need for more housing construction, infrastructure, and campaigns to further the cause of all labor, like the campaign to raise the minimum wage. As always, I encourage you to join our Political Action Committee, and talk to your Business Agent about ways to be involved and engaged. These efforts collectively make our voice louder and stronger in our communities.

Finally, I am happy to conclude on an even more positive note: June 3rd will be our first union election in nearly five years, followed by the end of the trusteeship on July 1st. I feel confident in saying that this upcoming election is likely the most important that we will see in our careers, and I want to

encourage every member to vote, doing so with the good faith and the best interest of this great union in mind. In November of 2021, I was appointed President, and since that time have done what I can to serve with the honesty and trustworthiness this membership is owed, and have never waived in my duty. These are the same values I committed to displaying in 2003, when I was first elected Organizer, and will continue to uphold wherever my career as a Steamfitter takes me. Our upcoming election is an important milestone in closing this challenging chapter for our union, and I hope you will join me in looking forward to the better times to come.

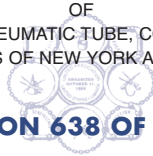

NOTICE of NOMINATIONS and GENERAL ELECTION **NOMINATION NOTICE**

Nominations for all officers & other elected positions of the Enterprise Association will be held on
WEDNESDAY, MAY 3, 2023, at 5:00 PM SHARP
at the Steamfitters Local 638 Union Hall, 32-32 48th Avenue, Long Island City, NY 11101

PLEASE NOTE:

Eligibility to Nominate: No member shall be eligible to nominate candidates unless he or she has been a member in good standing in Local 638 for a period of one (1) year immediately prior to the date of election. Any member who owes or has paid a reinstatement fee within a period of one (1) year immediately prior to the election shall not be eligible to nominate. Apprentice members who satisfy the foregoing requirements shall be eligible to nominate candidates if they have successfully completed their third apprenticeship year as of the date of the election. No seconds to a nomination will be required as long as the person making the nomination meets the above requirements. Members may nominate themselves.

Eligibility to Run: No member shall be eligible to accept a nomination or run for any office or other elected position unless he or she shall be a journeyman member and shall have been a member of the U.A. and Local 638 in good standing for at least a period of two (2) years immediately prior to the date of the election. Any journeyman member who owes or has paid a reinstatement fee within a period of two (2) years immediately prior to the date of the election shall not be eligible to be nominated.

Eligibility of Members with Business Interest: No member who holds a financial interest in any business directly connected with the plumbing and pipefitting industry may nominate candidates or run for or hold any office or other elected position until six months after the member has terminated such financial interest.

Important Item: A member who is unable to attend the Nominations Meeting for any reason shall be permitted to enter or accept a nomination by submitting a written or email notification identifying the office or position and the name and card number of the member nominated. The nomination must be received by Administrative Assistant to the Trustee, Clifford J. Ryder, Jr. by 5:00PM, EST on Wednesday, May 3, 2023, at the Union Office, 27-08 40th Avenue, Long Island City, NY 11101 or by email to cryder@lu638.com.

**Immediately following the Nominations Meeting, there will be a Candidates Meeting
to discuss the rules and requirements of the election.**

The General Election for all officers & other elected positions of the Enterprise Association will be held on **SATURDAY, JUNE 3, 2023, from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM at the Steamfitters Local 638 Union Meeting Hall, 32-32 48th Ave, Long Island City, NY 11101.**

Eligibility to Vote: No member is eligible to vote unless he or she has been a member in good standing in Local 638 for a period of one (1) year immediately prior to the date of the election. Any member who owes or has paid a reinstatement fee within a period of one (1) year immediately prior to the election shall not be eligible to vote in the election. In addition, any member who has entered into business legitimately for himself or herself, or who holds a financial interest in any business directly connected with the plumbing and pipe fitting industry, shall not have the right to vote unless six (6) months have passed since the member has terminated his or her business or financial interest in such business.

As provided in Section 148(b) of the U.A. Constitution, apprentice members who satisfy the foregoing requirements shall be eligible to vote if they have successfully completed their third apprenticeship year as of the date of the election.

All eligible Building Trades Journeyman, Building Trades Apprentices (4th & 5th Year ONLY) and Metal Trades members will be required to show their Enterprise Association Photo ID Card with their UA Card.

The Union Dues Office will NOT be open on Saturday, June 3rd, all business will occur at the Union Hall.

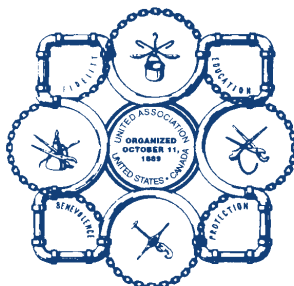
